I write to request your endorsement and financial support of my candidacy for State Representative from the 37th District (Farmington and Farmington Hills). While I expect the primary race against two Fellow Farmington Hills City Councilmembers to be a competitive one, it is my firm belief that no other candidate holds such a strong and consistent pro-labor record when it comes to advocating for Michigan's working middle class.

* I will fight to repeal the right-to-work-for-less law and its unfair and burdensome support for "free riders."

* I will protect Act 312 interest arbitration from perennial attack seeking to weaken it.

* I will fight for substantially increased funding for the Michigan agencies that handle employment discrimination, occupational safety and health, wage theft, wage-and-hour and misclassification complaints so that they may be less financially burdened and more capable of providing justice to safety workers without delay.
